Walkout, the much anticipated true story of a group of brave Chicano students who staged a dramatic walkout during the turbulent '60's directed by Edward James Olmos (Oscar® nominee), has completed production and will be premiered at CABE 2006 in San Jose before it debuts on HBO later in March.

The film, set against the background of the civil rights movement of 1968, a year of youth protest around the world, focuses specifically on the courage of a group of Chicano student protesting the injustices of the public school system in the East Los Angeles High Schools.

Along the way, the students learn powerful lessons about embracing their own identity and standing up for what they believe in. Set in 1968, a tumultuous year that shook America to its foundation, Walkout is a vivid reminder that people can change the world.

Sal Castro, the popular young teacher who worked with the students during the walkout will be honored with a CABE Board Award during this featured event.


Educating English Language Learners: A Synthesis of Research Evidence
